What do you do when it feels like there's nothing you can do?

Has anyone else felt this way over the past few months? There's this big bad thing called COVID-19 that has turned our world upside down, taken over much of our lives, filled us with both fear and frustration, and driven us crazy—because there is so much out of our control. There are no quick solutions. It's like we're on a roller coaster for the first time, but there are no handles to hold onto. In some ways we feel shipwrecked on an island, waiting for someone to rescue us.

If we're honest, our current predicament isn't the only time we've felt stuck—stuck in situations where there are a whole lot of questions and not enough answers. Seasons where it seems like "that's just the way it's going to be." Times when none of the options at our disposal are good ones—Do we run, give up, give in, get angry or resentful?

And, naturally, it's *in the meantime*—while we weather these seasons that we ask, "Where are you God? If you're really out there, how could you let this happen? Why have you abandoned us when we need you most?"

Folks, what if it's in these "in the meantime" moments that God is closer to us than we ever imagined? What if God has actually been more present than ever over the past few months? What if our ability to see God's hand at work just gets clouded in times like this—clouded by our fears, anxieties, and loss of control?

Here's what I know: God promises God will always show up...in the meantime.

What follows are the stories of all God has been up to *in the meantime* through you—our church—and our community over the past months. It is remarkable to see all the ways God has been at work as we've weathered the storm together.

From Calvary's President



"The Lord works in mysterious ways." Hans shared these words with me over the past few months as he has reflected on the irony that the Chief Medical Officer in town would happen to be serving as the president of our church council amid a global pandemic.

While I'm honored, I've reflected on those words in a very different way. Here's what I see: **Even though we've** sheltered-in-place and our lives have been restricted in so many ways, it's amazing to see all God has been doing through you over the past several months, Calvary!

When I think of all you have done for our church family and our community even amid this global pandemic, I can only point to God and say: The Lord works in mysterious ways. Here are a few things God has been doing through you:

- Alomere Hospital invited Calvary and other partners to help produce homemade masks we needed 4,000 masks and over 20,000+ have been sewn!
- We haven't been able to gather at the church (and won't for the foreseeable future), and yet 1,000's view worship and other content online and on TV. In the last month, on Facebook alone we've had 4,700 people watch an entire service from beginning to end. That doesn't include our website, YouTube, Cable Access viewers and those who tune in on the radio.
- Somehow the Calvary staff found a way for families to pack 1,200 bags of food for our Backpack Attack program while at the same time honoring social distancing, masking and disinfecting!
- We've given \$1,000's in gift cards to families in need through the High School food shelf.
- You are inviting people to join us for worship! People are tuning in for worship from as far away as Chicago and the Iron Range, Florida and Colorado, South Carolina and Leaf Valley!
- A little social distancing hasn't stopped our adult and student Connect Groups from meeting, they've just moved virtual. 100's are connecting online and growing deeper together.
- Through all of this, Innovative Builders continues to construct Calvary's building project on schedule. In fact, one phase of the project—upstairs—is now complete.
- COVID-19 hasn't stopped us from continuing to explore creative ways to partner with other churches, including a partnership with West Moe Lutheran Church that will bring a seminary intern in our midst.
- And, finally, even though we're not passing the plate, we've all continued to support Calvary in really generous ways. Your generosity has given us the confidence and ability to serve our community in a time when the community needs us most.

I could go on and on. I'm so proud of you. I'm proud to be a part of a church that knows the church is so much more than a building—a church that understands that the way we "love our neighbor as ourselves" is by protecting our neighbor. We wash our hands, stay home as often as possible, and mask up!

Work Advances on Building Project

One would think that the walls of the church are quiet without worship and other gatherings these days. But that is far from reality with the sounds of sledgehammers, drills, saws, and many other tools of construction. Work to expand and renovate our building has gained significant momentum, and we are well into the third and fourth phases of the project. We continue to be within budget and on schedule with the project, despite what feels like a giant pause in our lives over the past few months.

The renovation of the second floor is now complete. A new staff office suite was added for our staff to be together in one space. Two new multipurpose rooms named the Loft and Lookout—are ready to host groups of many sizes, including kids, students, and adult connect groups.

On the main level, work is well underway to prepare for connecting the addition to the existing building. The new preschool wing is being created to welcome our youngest learners back. The once unused courtyard is transforming from an empty slab into new restrooms and additional preschool space. And just one look at the facade of the building tells you that much has changed. Each week brings new progress on the exterior that reveals a little more of the end result.

We know many of you are anxious to get in and see the changes, so watch your email or calvaryalex.org/buildingproject for updates. It is not safe for anyone to enter the building given the raw state of construction, so thank you for staying away and being patient during this construction process. Thank you also for your continued generosity to make all this possible. Please continue to pray for the health and safety of our talented team of professionals working on the project. In the meantime, we continue to prepare our space for when we meet again inside its walls!

I feel fortunate that I have fought it and am still fighting it. I'm blessed with good people and good medical care and I'll keep going.

The original request was for 200 masks to Alomere, and since then people have donated materials, cut fabric, tracked down elastic, and sewn more than 20,000 masks for the hospital, clinics, care facilities, organizations, and individuals in the Alexandria area!
